INHERIT project promotes sustainable tourism using a double approach. Valorizing underexploited natural heritage areas, labelled as "INHERITURA" areas, with the integration of tourism activities to obtain sustainable destinations, under enhanced protection of natural and cultural resources, while tackling mass tourism pressure, seasonality and locality peaks in MED coastal and maritime tourism destinations.

INTERREG MED European funding for 4 years 2018 – 2022

15 partners from 10 countries in the Northern Mediterranean area





Situation analysis in Med partner countries

Three main negative impacts (UNEP, 2001):





- ❖ Pollution: air pollution and noise, solid waste and littering, sewage, aesthetic pollution
- ❖ Physical impacts: construction activities and development of infrastructure, deforestation, marina development, extensive paving of shorelines, trampling, anchoring, alteration of ecosystems by activities

Positive aspects of tourism development

- ✓ **Income**: stimulation of rural development, dynamism and attractivity, public investment
- ✓ Preservation of natural sites if considered economically valuable
- √ Valorization of cultural heritage







The project objectives

- 1. Identify **efficient protection measures** for natural heritage, forests and biodiversity
- 2. Test and capitalize sustainable tourism activities
- 3. Create **INHERITURA** areas to promote exchange of practices, compliance with measures, multi-destination tourism



- 1. Monitoring the sustainability of tourism: what are the knowledge gaps of policy-making processes? How to bridge the data gaps on tourism?
- 2. How to reduce the environmental-cultural- social impacts of tourism in the Mediterranean region?
- 3. How can the tourism sector ensure a sustainable and responsible economic growth and prosperity in the Mediterranean region?
- 4. How to address the complexity of the tourism sector, including local actors, decision-makers and consumers?

Output:

a policy paper gathering all policy recommendations coming from the community
